

Congratulations on your new glass shower enclosure! We want our customers to be 110% satisfied with our products. There are a few simple steps to increase the life of your shower. By following the guidelines below, you will enjoy your new shower enclosure for many years!

Caring for your shower:

- Clean with a squeegee or clean dry cloth after every use.
- Clean shower with approved cleaner every few weeks. Examples of cleaners: Windex (Standard, Vinegar, Alcohol, Ammonia), SprayWay (or other alcohol-based foaming cleaners), Scrubbing Bubbles (or other automatic leave-to-dry daily shower cleaners), 7th Generation (or other mild Green cleaners), Vinegar or Citric acid (undiluted is fine), Alcohols, Ammonias, Solvents, CLR
- Make sure shower is well ventilated. Leave door cracked to lessen mold/mildew.

What NOT to do:

- **DO NOT** Use the following types of cleaning agents on shower glass or hardware:
 - Harsh or chemical cleaners, abrasives or polishes including Water Spot Removers, Toothpaste, Polishes, Rough, or Gritty substances, or Acids or Alkalis.
- **DO NOT** use towel bars or handles as a grab bar. The hardware is not equipped to support the weight or force.
- **DO NOT** use excessive force to open or close door, or allow the glass to come in contact with any walls or fixtures.
- **DO NOT** hang bath mats or dripping wet towels over the door. The extra weight could potentially cause the door to pull away from the hinges.
- Shower enclosures are not watertight. Although St. Louis Glass Works takes precautions to minimize leaks, there are times that a shower will leak. To avoid leaks, do not aim shower head at door or use a removable shower head or any other excessive water pressure while cleaning shower.
